SEASON #3 (SPRING 2003) RECAP:

With only 5 returning Phantoms, the 2003 Spring team would be entirely different than those teams from the past. New talent was added to the roster and for the first time in 2 seasons, everyone was excited about the team and for the season to begin. With the high amount of changes in players between the 2nd and 3rd seasons, the team had to change names to help bring everyone together. On February 4, the team announced that it was changing its name from the Muskegon Phantoms to the West Michigan Phantoms. With only a few players now from the Muskegon area, the change was needed to unite everyone under a new banner, a banner that would fly high during the season. In what could be considered a Cinderella Season, the Phantoms went from 4-5-1 the season before, to an impressive 10-0 with the new West Michigan Phantoms. Team chemistry would be at an all-time high and it would show as the team would light the lamp 76 times and would only feel set-back in 19 goals against during the regular season. Unlike the prior season, the Phantoms would again get back into the play-offs and skate on Play-off Saturday, however, would suffer a 2-1 loss in the opening round of the play-offs.
