SUSPICIOUS LOSS ENDS PLAY-OFF RUN

The Phantoms chance to Repeat the Feat ended early on Saturday, as Dynamo came back to defeat the Phantoms by the final of 4-3. Brad Zehr scored the game's first goal less than 30 seconds into the contest. Brian Doctor and Matt Myers would be the other two marksmen for the Phantoms. The Phantoms watched as Dynamo never gave up and capitalized on several Phantom errors. Despite the loss, the Phantoms complete the Summer 2006 season with an overall record of 9-2-0.
